2021 Annual Fall Shoot - October 2

The UPMLA's Open Invitational and Fall Memorial Shoot is scheduled for Saturday, October 2, at the Ottawa Sportsmen's Club near Baraga. Registration starts at 10:30 am Eastern time and the events begin at 11:00. The registration fee is \$3.

There will be a **Pot Luck Lunch** immediately after the four events. <u>Please bring a dish to share</u>. Contact UPMLA President Lyle Hebert with questions about the pot luck lunch.

The Fall Shoot is a decades-old UPMLA tradition. Four years ago the knife and hawk throwing and longbow events were added, with a decrease in the time spent rifle shooting. The events this year will be similar to those of recent years. Jon and Kate Henkel are organizing this year's competitions.

Event #1: Muzzleloading Rifle Match - Each participant takes six shots at a paper target, with the score based on the total of the five best shots.

Event #2: Team ML Rifle Match – Two-person teams will be assembled semi-randomly on site. Each partner will shoot twice at a target. The team score will be based on a combination of the four shots.

Event #3: Hawk & Knife Match – This is an individual event. Each participant will make three throws at a paper bullseye target with a hawk and three throws with a knife. Score is sum of best five of six throws.

Event #4: Longbow Match - Each participant will take six shots at targets. The best five hits will be counted for score.

The first place winners of each event will receive a prize of a choice cut of meat. Nice edible prizes will also be given to the second, third and possibly lower place finishers.

The traveling Sandra Lee Henkel Memorial trophy will be presented to the individual having the highest aggregate score for Events 1, 3, and 4.

UPMLA Officers for 2021-22

Description and Discussion of a Special Muzzleloader

On Friday evening of the Rendezvous, UPMLA member Tom Snyder described to a fascinated group of members how he constructed a replica of a rifle built in 1776 by his multiplegreats-grandfather. The original is now in Philadelphia at the Museum of the American Revolution.

The museum curators gave permission for Tom to handle, and to photograph and make measurements and drawings of the piece. Based on these, Tom closely re-created the original, including making the lock himself rather than using a modern commercial lock. Tom's rifle was amazingly light in weight.

The participants spent a couple of hours handling Tom's rifle and asking questions about how it was conceived and about details of construction and ornamentation.

Award of Appreciation

At the close of the annual business meeting, President Lyle Hebert announced that Jim Mead was the recipient of the 2021 Award of Appreciation for his years of help with a broad range of activities. Winter and Spring Monthly UPMLA Shoots - 2022

For the coming calendar year, UPMLA monthly shoots will be held as usual on the first Saturday of the month except for the date in January. The dates of the shoots for 2020 are:

- January 8 March 5 May 7
- February 5 April 2 June 4

In January the first Saturday is January 1, New Years Day. Those who schedule the shoots were pretty wary, and assumed that attendance would probably be low on the holiday. So, the shoot was moved to January 8. The shoots will take place at the Ottawa Sportsmen's Club near Baraga. The format will probably follow that of monthly shoots occurring during the past several years. Changes may be made due to circumstances or from sheer contrariness of shoot organizers. Registration begins at 10:30 AM Eastern time. Shooting starts at 11:00. The Ottawa club will be co-sponsor of the shoots of January, March, April, and June as part of long-standing arrangements between that club and the UPMLA.

Membership Requirements at Rendezvous

Some members have expressed confusion about membership and UPMLA activities. Here's some clarification (we hope). For shoots in January-June and October, membership is not required to participate. However, at the Rendezvous <u>only</u> <u>members</u> may participate in shooting, throwing, and some other activities. Youth events are an exception. Accompanying non-member persons are welcome to join in other activities. (Think pot luck – Yummy!)

Results of Competitive Events at the 2021 Rendezvous

A printed summary of the various shooting throwing, and other events that take place at Rendezvous is usually included with the mailing of the Fall Newsletter. Postal recipients of this newsletter will notice that such a summary is notably absent from their envelopes. The gremlins that are responsible for lost keys, eyeglasses, pocket knives, homework papers, and similar items have been working overtime in the Office of Newsletter Production, and a couple of hand-written lists from the rendezvous have entered a local black hole. These will be reconstructed and the summary will be sent with the next issue

More Notes about the Rendezvous

In particular, the efforts of Lyle Hebert and Clint Collick in designing Fun Shoot events should be noted. The golf ball shoot for distance showed golf balls taking healthy hits with little damage. Taking shots at toy military tanks with muzzle loading rifles gave shooters an anachronistic thrill when a turret was sent flying. The cannon-fuse timed event requires too much space for a written description, so ask Lyle about it. Thanks to Clint and Lyle for planning and running the event.
